Report Section	Information
Attendance	This section shows the students percentage attendance, this academic year to date. Excellent attendance is one of the best indicators of academic success and therefore as a school, we aim for this to be as high as possible and our target is that all students have an attendance above 95%.
% Assessment Mark	This column shows the percentage that the student achieved in the assessment in that subject. If there is an 'X' in the column, this means that the student was absent and did not sit the assessment.
GCSE Grade	This column shows how the assessment percentage corresponds to a GCSE grade. GCSE grades are on a 1-9 scale, with a grade 9 being the highest grade a student can achieve in their GCSE subjects. As a guide, a grade 4 is equivalent to a C grade under the old system and a grade 7 is the equivalent to an A grade. In Science students are awarded 2 grades, as it is a double award GCSE. For example, if the grade on the report is 4.4, this means that the student has achieved 2 GCSE grade 4s in science.

	<p>The students have only received a grade for English Literature as this was the only exam English that was completed in the PPE assessments. Students will sit an English language paper in January, and you will be informed of your child's progress in this exam.</p> <p>In vocational subjects (enterprise, health and social care, performing arts, hospitality and catering, sport, IT and music) the grades are awarded on a different scale. Where a level 2 distinction is the highest grade and a level 1 pass is the lowest grade. The grades for vocational subjects are shown below from highest to lowest.</p> <p>L2D*- Level 2 Distinction* L2D- Level 2 Distinction L2M- Level 2 Merit L2P- Level 2 Pass L1D- Level 1 Distinction L1M- Level 1 Merit L1P- Level 1 Pass</p> <p>It is important to note that, with hard work and commitment to the year 11 strategy it is possible to improve these grades significantly before the final exams in the Summer.</p>
