Jean-Patrick Cheylan

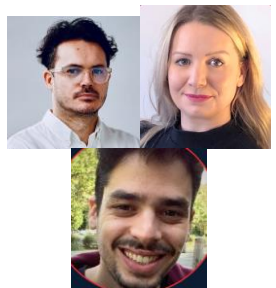
Head of Entertainment Partnerships, Europe, Twitter
