9	<p>Creativity Perhaps one of the most significant choices that students must make in year 9 are which subjects they will choose to study at GCSE, finalised at the Options Evening. 10	<p>Ambition As GCSE year begins, we find student determination to succeed highly increases, along with their maturing as independent learners. In order to continue to link student academic experience with their future careers and aspirations for the future, Year 10 will be provided with guidance on the range of pathways available to them beyond school. In addition, all Year 10 students will have the opportunity to experience a workplace during Work Experience Week.</p> <p>Students are also encouraged and supported to undertake meaningful workplace experiences beyond their school experience.</p>	<p>Building on the experiences of the Spartan Test in the previous year, all students will attend an assembly introducing work experience, guiding students specifically finding meaningful placements that will help them consider first-hand if a certain industry or sector is for them.</p> <p>Students will experience Careers Week, a weeklong period dedicated to workshop days involving employers delivering sessions on different roles within their sector, employability skills, CV building and professionalism.
